Let me start off by wishing everyone a Very Happy and Healthy 2026.

Lady Sandy joins me in this wish to all of you and your Lady Knights. Unfortunately, Lady Sandy will not have an article in this newsletter but will in the future when she recovers from her injury and illnesses.



We who have been fortunate enough to live a reasonably long life know that life has many unanticipated twists and turns as we navigate through life discerning God's plan for us. Every day is a gift from God. I assumed the Master position on September 1, 2025. Lady Sandy and I were looking forward to our first Exemplification in October and the year ahead. We attended the Former Master's picnic on September 6 with Former Master Joe Yekulis and Lady Denise and had a wonderful time with many of the Former Masters who served in Michigan. The very next day Lady Sandy suffered a catastrophic fall resulting in a fractured femur. Besides being in shock from the fracture, it was discovered she had sepsis from an infection which caused all her major systems to shut down. The prognosis was grim. Her doctors did not believe she would survive. She was in ICU for 19 days.

Lady Sandy and I send a heartfelt thanks to everyone for your prayers, Masses, Rosaries, cards, and expressions of support and concern. Those prayers I believe are the reason Lady Sandy is alive today. She is at home learning to walk and balance herself again and looks forward to joining me and her Lady Knights in the wonderful activities in Michigan District 2.

For those who doubt the healing power of prayer or want an excellent inspirational read, I recommend Dr Marc Siegel's book entitled **The Miracles Among Us: How God's Grace Plays a Role in Healing**. Dr Siegel is a Clinical Professor of Medicine at NYU Langone Health and a devout practitioner of the Jewish religion. The book is on the **New York Times** Best Seller list. Ironically it came out when Lady Sandy was battling for her life. The timing was incredible as I lived the Miracles that Dr Siegel wrote about so eloquently.

Michigan District 2 2026 Biennial Meeting March 21, 2026

The 2026 Spring Biennial Meeting for Michigan 2 will be held on Saturday, March 21, 2026, at Queen of the Miraculous Medal Church Vincentian Hall, 1111 Carleton Blvd. Jackson MI 49203. Registration will begin at 8:30 am. Meeting will start at 9 am and conclude at 1 pm. Lunch will be provided. Free Will donations are encouraged to cover the cost. This meeting is mandatory for all Navigators and should include your Comptrollers and CC Commanders along with your delegates and alternates chosen at your February or early March meetings. Other leadership members you would like to bring along are welcome. FN Tim Hill and the Jackson Assembly #2186 will be the host Assembly.

The Laws and Rules of the Fourth Degree require that three candidates for the Master position must be submitted to the State Deputy, Vice Supreme Master and Supreme Master for consideration at this meeting. The candidates will be selected by your Assembly's delegates. The term of office is two years and limited to two terms.

The 92nd District 2 Exemplification April 18, 2026

It is my great privilege to announce that Michigan District 2 will hold its 92nd Exemplification on April 18, 2026, at St Mary Cathedral in Lansing. Bishop Albers Assembly #496 under the direction of FN Phillip D. Schertzing, and Lansing Assembly #3334 under the direction of FN Paul LaCroix will be the host Assemblies.

This is a one-day event. There will be a Master's Banquet after the 4:00 pm Mass. The Class Honoree is SK David Lennemann long time District 2 Degree Team Captain. David is certainly deserving of this honor for his dedicated service to Michigan District 2 serving as Degree Team Captain for over 20 years. David is battling Stage 3 colon cancer. Please keep him in your prayers.

I add my voice to Membership Director Dave Zerbe's appeal to all Faithful Navigators and members of your Assemblies to recruit 3rd Degree members into the 4th Degree so they can achieve full Knighthood at the new wonderful 4th Degree Exemplification ceremonial on April 18th.

I ask all of you to reach out to your District Deputies and Grand Knights in your Assembly councils to ensure they have the 4th Degree on their meeting agendas. Please make a visit to your councils to keep the members apprised as to what is going on in your assemblies. Please make a personal appeal to non-4th degree members to join. Please make sure you have a liaison in every council. Lastly, reach out to Dave Zerbe or me if you need help in your recruiting efforts.

The goal set for new membership by the Supreme for our District is 197 new members. As of January 30, 2026, we are at 38 new members, which is 19% of our goal. I know that by working together we can make our goal.

Membership recruiting is important to the survival of our organization. In our District last year, from January 2025 to January 2026, 95% of the Assemblies lost members. My home Jackson Assembly lost three Sir Knights who were called home by God, two in the last four months.

Let me begin, on behalf of Lady Cindi and myself, by hoping your Christmas was peaceful and blessed and that 2026 will be the same. The year seems to be starting out slowly. There are the diocesan meetings and the council district meetings in January and February. Michigan District 2 gets going with the district meeting on March 21 and a lot happens from then leading up to the 4th degree exemplification on April 18 at St. Mary Cathedral in Lansing. The Color Corps will be called upon to look and perform their best at this time.

The Color Corps is receiving some guidance from the Supreme Master Michael McCusker on how it might improve. The faithful navigators received from Master Ben Dandrow a copy of the appearance guidelines for the Color Corps. I hope the assembly commander has received this and has looked it over. For the most part these guidelines have been in place for many years. There are a few additions in keeping up with the times and some clarifications. Please accept these in the spirit they are intended to present the Color Corps as a dignified unit worthy of representing the Order and our Church.

Another piece of guidance received by the Color Corps comes by way of Michigan District 1 where Archbishop Weisenburger directed the Color Corps not to place swords on the casket and say prayers for a deceased Sir Knight after the funeral Mass before the casket is placed in the hearse. The timing of this is different than what we do in Michigan District 2 but until Master Ben meets with the bishops of Lansing and Kalamazoo to introduce himself and learn their wishes of the 4th degree we will discontinue placing swords on the casket. We will try to get clarification on this as soon as possible and let the assemblies know.

Let me bring you up to date on the District Marshals. In the Kalamazoo Diocese Marshal Dave Censke is temporarily on injured reserve following surgery. Your prayers will be helpful in speeding his return. Dave Van Hoof is the other marshal, an experienced assembly commander. In the Lansing Diocese the district marshals are Don Pollard, also an experienced commander, and Paul Funk. Paul is eager to receive more training for the job; however, he may also be on injured reserve for a period of time. I'm sure he would welcome prayers also. Continue the training of your assembly Honor Guard. The District Marshals and I are available to conduct training for your assemblies. All you have to do is ask.

During our life, if we are blessed and lucky, we are allowed to wear many different “hats”, participate in many different functions, learn many important lessons (some from extraordinary persons and brother Knights) and then have the privilege of passing on those experiences, blessings and truths to our friends, neighbors, and fellow Catholics. As we celebrate the 250th Anniversary of our Country, please allow me to share some of my experiences and lessons I have learned during the past few years in which I have been a Knight of Columbus and member of the Patriotic Fourth Degree.



A few experiences we can tell our friends regarding the Knights of Columbus and specifically of Sir Knights of the Patriotic Fourth Degree are these. Nationally and around the world, Knights of Columbus play a role in strengthening Eucharistic faith in their parishes by regularly participating in Mass, organizing Holy Hours, leading Eucharistic Processions, and adding reverence to special liturgies as part of Fourth Degree honor guards.

I remember one such experience where I had the honor of participating in, as a “rookie” member of the Fourth Degree Honor Guard, that occurred on September 22, 2018 during the ‘Made for Happiness’ Eucharistic gathering in Lansing, Michigan. During that perfect Saturday afternoon, a four mile Eucharistic procession from St. Mary Cathedral to the MSU Breslin Center was led by 40 plus of my fellow Honor Guard members in a four mile walk in which we lead 4,000 faithful in a public adoration of the Eucharist. I also stood guard for a few hours inside the section of the Breslin Center where 14,000 faithful had the opportunity to witness and pray in front of sacred relics before Mass began. I think that was the first day I glimpsed an understanding of the importance of being an Honor Guard member and what our presence meant to our fellow Catholics.

I have been back to St. Mary’s in Lansing often since that Saturday afternoon in 2018 as an Honor Guard member. And I plan on returning once again on April 18th for our 92nd Fourth Degree Exemplification Knighting Ceremony in which I can’t help but recall these words by Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, “On the day I was installed, I spoke of our calling to be **Knights of the Eucharist** ... The more we devote ourselves to the Eucharist, the more we will understand what it means to be a Knight - to live a life of service and sacrifice for others and to live a life of true unity, centered on the 'source and summit' of the Christian life.”

And perhaps I may again have the honor during this Exemplification Ceremony, to teach these **New Knights of the Eucharist**, these valuable lessons and insights as the Expositor of the Faith and speak these words designed to help them prepare and take a more active part in the life of our Nation and to encourage my brother Sir Knights to pray the Luminous Mysteries (such as the mystery of the Eucharist) which illuminate the public life of Christ.

The Expositor of the Faith will remind them and all present “...that the Knights of Columbus will always stand sure and unyielding in our place of the walls of our nation’s freedom, that we will do so in the best tradition of Catholic knighthood, always guided by the sure beacon of what is just and by the timeless principles of charity, unity, fraternity and patriotism.”

And he will speak this line. “We judge that in the life of every Nation not every time is as good as another. But for us there is one time which is more important than any other. And that is the time that has been allotted to us.” As for myself, I can think of no better use of the time left for me than to be ... **A Knight of the Eucharist.**

2025 was a very good year for the Knights in the Kalamazoo Diocese in our service to the Battle Creek VA Hospital. I owe special thanks to my fellow VAVS Rep. Jim Pitsch, for all his help with organizing the car show this past summer, the collection of donations for veterans, and his diligent work at getting the treat cart program going again. The treat cart program had been cancelled in 2020 at the onset of Covid, after many years of service.

This endeavor took approximately two years to get reinstated due to lack of storage space at the VA for the treat cart itself. Brother Pitsch and myself kept at it and they were finally able to find a storage space for the cart. Special thanks to Brothers Tom Kerr FN of Assembly 2135 in Otsego and FN David Censke of Assembly 505 who attended the Winter Carnival at the VA in December and were able to get the ball across the finish line through encouraging dialogue with the management. A storage spot was created for the treat cart program in Buildings 83 and 84.

I would also like to thank the five councils of Assembly 505 and the parishioners of St. Phillip Church in Battle Creek who donated a total of \$3,100 in donations of goods for our men and women veterans and their children. These donations were obtained through our fall collection drives. I would also like to thank Assembly 505 for putting a donation of \$430 together the weekend before Christmas for a veteran who is a mother of four children in need of help obtaining Christmas presents for her children.

To cap off a great year for our veterans at the VA, PWDM Joe Yekulis came to town on December 30, and he and I took a check for \$1,500 to the Battle Creek VA Hospital as a donation from the Michigan District 2 Operation Patriotism Program.

In closing, I would like to thank all 4th Degree members, their families and friends who gave such generous support to our veterans this past year.

VAVS Report January 2026

The Fourth Degree Cardinal O'Hara and Msgr. Fedewa Assembly have been active in support of veterans served by the Ann Arbor Veterans Administration Medical Center.

Cardinal O'Hara Assembly donated 16 Empowerment Coats for homeless veterans (\$2,400 value). These winter coats can provide protection during the day, and can be unfolded to become sleeping bags at night. The coat/sleeping bags are created by The Empowerment Plan, a non-profit organization. The coats are manufactured by individuals experiencing homelessness, providing them with employment, training, and a path to independence while also giving warmth and shelter to others in need.

I encourage assemblies and councils to follow the lead of the Cardinal O'Hara Assembly and consider providing additional coats to our veterans in need. In addition to Empowerment Coats, the Cardinal O'Hara Assembly provided 2 carts of in-kind donations to the Voluntary Services department of the Ann Arbor VA Hospital and conducted bi-monthly bingos for the veterans confined to the Community Living Center Ward.

Msgr. Fedewa Assembly has also been active in providing in-kind donations to the Ann Arbor VA Hospital. Faithful Navigator Paul Funk encouraged councils to conduct parish-wide collections for veterans. Initially, the collections were focused upon "Sox Drives" (athletic and dress sox). However, the collections quickly expanded to other clothing items (underwear) and personal hygiene items. The result was over-whelming. Four Councils (St Joseph -#2659, St John #8169, St Agnes #8605, and Fr Leo McCann #7304) organized "Sox Drives" collecting more than 1,400 pairs of athletic and dress sox with additional items. *(it required three vehicles to deliver them).*

Another Fedewa Assembly in-kind donation initiative is provision of incontinence clothing for homeless and outpatient veterans. The Assembly through the St Mary Magdalen Council #12295 continued to work with a local Senior Center to provide these items at no cost. The Fedewa Assembly has also encouraged its councils to reach out to their parishes' Prayer Shawl Committee and knitting circles to provide hand-made blankets, shawls and caps too

for the veterans. The result was likewise overwhelming. Ladies from the St Mary Magdalen Parish (Council #12295) and St Agnes Parish (Council #8605) crocheted magnificent blankets. 72 blankets were delivered in person to VA hospital patients in celebration of Veterans Day. An additional 42 blankets were included within the Christmas gift packages distributed during the Assembly's regularly scheduled Christmas bingo event.



Proper Honor/Color Guard Dress Attire



- Official Navy Blue Blazer with 4th Degree Emblem Blazer Crest
- Official 4th Degree Gray Pants, straight leg, **“NO”** cuffs
- Official 4th Degree Necktie, now available in extra long
- Official 4th Degree Black Beret with 4th Degree Metal Badge with appropriate color patch under badge
- Plain Full Collar White Dress Shirt, Button Cuffs (no French cuffs, no button down collar shirt)
- Black Socks and Plain Black **“Polished”** Shoes
- Official 4th Degree Lapel Pin PG-113
- Incumbent Medal of Office
- Past and Former miniature medals above left pocket
- Service Baldric and Sword
- White Gloves
- Name badge **“ARE NOT”** to be worn at any time, during or after an event
- “The Supply Room” Top Coat
 - Pins, only the PG-113 pin shall be worn on the top coat lapel at the buttonhole.
 - Absolutely no service medals will be worn on the top coat. Medals are reserved for wear only on the uniform jacket.

Appendix C. Supreme Council and Supreme Assembly event appearance guidelines.

As the most visible arm of the Order, those in Fourth Degree Regalia should strive for excellence in appearance in every detail. In accordance with Supreme Master's Policy governing Supreme Council and Supreme Assembly designated events:

Hair Regulations

- Hair should not extend below the collar when standing at attention.
- Hair should not exceed a bulk of 2 inches.
- Hair should not obstruct the proper fit of the Beret.
- Hair should not be styled in a ponytail, mohawk or mullet*.
- Hair styled as a ponytail, mohawk or mullet must be properly concealed without obstructing the proper fit of the beret.
- Hair should not include extreme sideburns.
- Hair should not be unnatural or exaggerated colors.
- Hair should not be greasy or unwashed in appearance.

Beard regulations

- Beards must be kept neatly trimmed
- Beards must be under 3 inches in length
- Beards must be trimmed at the cheekbones and neck
- Beards cannot be patchy or uneven
- Beards cannot be unnatural exaggerated colors

Regalia Fit Regulations

- The coat should fit easily over the chest and shoulders
- Only the top button of the coat should be buttoned.
- The coat collar should fit close around the neck without gapping or overlapping, with the shirt collar showing at least 1/4 to 1/2 inch above the coat collar at the center back of the coat.
- Coat front and back should be smooth and even at the bottom edges with no protruding or spreading
- The back hem of the trousers should fall approximately midway between the top of the heel and the top of the standard shoe in the back.
- The bottom of the front crease of the trousers should reach the top of the instep. The trousers may have a slight break in the front.
- The trousers should be full enough around the hips to prevent the side pockets from spreading. The seat must be an easy fit with no wrinkles below the back waist.

Other Regulations:

- No earrings
- No facial piercings
- Hand and Facial Tattoos are strictly prohibited

These standards are applicable to designated Supreme Council and Supreme Assembly events requiring Color Corps participation. Local assemblies are expected to adhere to these standards but may make exceptions to the guidelines where a member's cultural heritage may impact his ability to comply with these standards. Where no cultural exception is applicable, an individual refusing to adhere to these standards may be barred from participating in color corps events by the District Master. When this occurs, the District Master must pass the request for an exemption through the chain of command for review by the Supreme Master's Office. While the review is pending, the member may continue participating in color corps activities.


In summary, the Color Corps is designed to lend dignity, pomp, and circumstance to religious and patriotic events. Members are to present themselves so as not to detract from the gravity of the occasion. Personal styling preferences should never trump the honor shown to Holy Mother Church.

NOTE: *Cultural sensitivity should be given to members who wear a particular style of hair or beard, e.g. indigenous peoples with a specific, traditional style of hair
