#### "Behold Your Mother" (Jn. 19:27)

2025 is almost gone, and 2026 will be in our hands within a few days. There are more plans for the new year; there are some New Year's resolutions and other things.

Whatever it is, as Catholics, we start our New Year celebrating "Mary Mother of God." Our blessed Mother plays an important role in our lives.

Under the cross, Mary became the mother of the Church and our mother. As she was standing by the cross, Jesus looked down and (Jn. 19:26) he saw his mother and the disciple whom He loved, and He said: "Woman, behold your son!" Then He said to the disciple: "Behold your mother". From that moment, the disciple took her into his home. Mary will never forget those words of Jesus to her: "Behold your son." we are now her sons and daughters, and she surrounds us with the same care, love, and gentleness that she had for Jesus; she wants to help us become like Jesus.

We too should never forget Jesus' words on the cross to us: "Behold your mother!" and like the disciple in the Gospel "took her into his home," we too should take her into our home and make her part of our family, we too should take her in our hearts and make her part of our life. But how can we "behold" the face of our mother if we don't even have a picture of our blessed mother to remind us of her presence?

Once upon a time, a priest shared the following incident: As he was going into a town, he saw a garage sale sign. He stopped by a garage sale looking for bargains, and as he was going around, he saw an old picture of the Blessed Mother with the price of fifty cents. He asked the young lady in charge about the picture, and she said that the old picture came from Ireland, her great-grandmother brought it, and it has been in the family ever since, but now she was moving into the new house, and it didn't fit, it didn't look good with the rest of the furniture. He told her: "You know how many prayers were said in front of that picture, how many sufferings were comforted, how many tears were wiped away, how many problems were solved in prayer... the history of your family hangs with that picture, how can you sell it for fifty cents?" Then the priest left. But the next day, the priest was passing by, and out of curiosity, he stopped and looked for the picture, and it was gone. The priest asked the young lady: "It looks like you sold the picture". She answered: "No, father. I thought about what you said; I think you are right, so I kept it. I will find a good place for her in the new house."

Sometimes, we feel the same way: "She doesn't fit." We have all kinds of different pictures in our homes, but not the picture of our Blessed Mother, or if we have one, maybe it is not in a prominent place. Isn't it true: "Out of sight, out of mind?" Let us invite our Blessed Mother back into our homes; without her, we are orphans.

Let us listen to Jesus' words on the cross to us: "Behold your mother!"
